170g/6oz Plain Flour

120g/4oz Butter

50g/2oz Caster Sugar

Sift flour into bowl, add sugar, add butter cut into small pieces and rub in with fingertips until mixture begins to stick together. Turn onto lightly floured surface and knead well until smooth. Roll out to an 8" circle, place onto a lined flan tin or ring. Press lightly into ring and smooth surface. Prick with a fork all over in a neat pattern. Neatly pinch the edges or mark with a spoon handle. Mark into 8 triangles with a knife. Bake in oven 170°C (325°F) for 35 to 40 minutes until golden in colour. When cool sprinkle lightly with caster sugar.
