RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1 The object of the Society is to improve the breeding of Horses, Cattle, Sheep generally, also horse manship and stock handling. Prizes will be given under the following conditions.
- 2 All objections to be made in writing, and lodged with the Secretary. The objection shall be made within 30 minutes of the end of the Class with a deposit of £30.00, which amount shall be forfeited should the objection not be upheld.
- 3 All disputes to be settled by the Committee, whose decisions shall be final.
- 4 The Show to commence at 8.30a.m. prompt.
- 5 If, in the opinion of the judges, the exhibits in any class are of insufficient merit, the Committee reserves the right to withhold the whole or any of the prizes.
- 6 All entries must be accompanied by entry and first aid fees, to be sent to the Entry Secretary on or before Thursday, 5th May, 2022.
- 7 The rules of an affiliated society shall apply where required under the conditions of affiliation.
- 8 Correctly secured Skull Caps/Riding Hats that meet current Safety Standards, as directed by breed and affiliated societies MUST be worn by riders at all times when mounted.
- 9 The classes will be judged in the order in which they appear in the Catalogue, but if considered necessary, this order will be changed and the exhibits not brought into the ring immediately on being called by the Stewards will be disqualified.
- 10 Appropriate passes and numbers will be posted to competitors, these will be sent to the primary address supplied.
- 11 Each Perpetual Cup/Trophy to be held by the winner under a guarantee for 11 months: (i) that it will be delivered up in good condition, to the Secretary or the Cup/Trophy Steward, one month prior to the date of the next show; (ii) that in the event of its loss the amount of its value will be made good to the Society by the winner.
- 12 All Championship Trophies will be presented following the Supreme championship (WR Pugh Perpetual Trophy) judging. The committee reserves the right to withhold any trophies should the Champion not take part in the Supreme championship event.
- 13 All animals will be considered and treated as being in the sole charge of the exhibitors, or their servants, during the whole of the time they are on the Show Field, and the Show Committee will not be responsible for any loss, damage or injury arising from accidents or other causes.
- 14 All Stallions, four years old and over, must hold a current licence and handled by an adult (16 years old and over). Foals to be at least three weeks old and over on Show Day.
- 15 If there are fewer than 3 exhibits in any of the Horse/Pony classes then that class could be amalgamated at the Committee's discretion.
- 16 Cattle and Sheep entries will be taken on the day, they may also be pre-entered. No cattle or sheep exhibitor's names will be printed in the catalogue.
- 17 Only the driver of stock carrying vehicles in the cattle, sheep and Showjumping sections will be admitted free of charge. All other passengers must pay the full entrance charge.
- 18 For further information or queries please communicate with the Show Secretary who will bring it to the attention of the appropriate official/s. At all times the Committee's decisions will be enforced and final.
- 19 Under no circumstances are collections to be made on the Field.
- 20 The Committee will not be responsible for any error which may appear in the Schedule/ Catalogue, or for any entry made in the wrong class and number cards must be placed on exhibits in such a way that they may be readily seen by the spectators.
- 21 The Committee reserves the right to amend the rules at any time.

HEALTH AND SAFETY

Key Cothi Bridge Show (CBS) Health and Safety documents include:

- 1 CBS H&S Policy
- 2. Pavilion Fire Plan, and Emergency Procedures

Both documents are available on the CBS web site (https://www.cothibridgeshow.cymru). Printed copies shall also be available on the day of the show in the Secretary's office.

HEATH AND SAFETY STATEMENT OF GENERAL POLICY

The Society is committed to ensuring that all activities relating to the show are carried out with safety as its primary concern to not cause ill health or injury. Specifically, it will so far as is reasonably practicable:

- Conduct the Society's undertaking in such a way as to ensure persons who may be involved in coordinating, participating in, or attending the activities of the show are not exposed to risks to their Health and Safety.
- Bring to the notice of all Exhibitors, Retailers, Caterers and their Agents and Employees, their duty to co-operate
 with the Society to ensure that this Policy is effective and to offer all necessary assistance to ensure the Health
 and Safety at the Show of all Exhibitors and others on the Society's Showground.
- Require those participating in, or attending, the Show to assist the Society in their aims of preventing accidents
 and abiding by the instructions given by Officials and Stewards before, during and after the event.
- Ensure that appropriate risk assessments are carried out for the Society's activities and be provided by and agreed with individual exhibitors.

EMERGENCY PROCEDURES

The emergency procedures should be adhered to in the event of a Major Incident occurring on the Showground during the Show, and are as follows:

- (a) The Safety Officer should be contacted immediately by public address or radio.
- (b) The Major Incident Control point will be the SECRETARY'S OFFICE.
- (c) First Aid sites are as located on the emergency plan at the back of the catalogue. If needed, contact should be made with the nearest St. John's Ambulance personnel and the duty doctor.
- (d) Traffic and Gate Stewards will assist emergency vehicles to the scene of the incident.
- (e) The Casualty Centre will be the Main Pavilion.
- (f) Specific assembly points have been marked on the emergency plan, as in most emergency situations it will not be necessary to evacuate the showground. Stewards will direct the public to these areas.

REPORTING OF INJURIES AND DANGEROUS OCCURRENCES (RIDDOR)

Any accident or incident must be reported to the Show Safety Officer immediately. The Safety Officer will investigate all incidents and liaise with the appropriate enforcing authority and show organisation. All accidents will be recorded in the Society's accident book.

HEALTH AND SAFETY ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

The Society has overall responsibility for overseeing H&S matters and shall require everybody under its control to be familiar with regulations and codes of practice relevant to their activity, and with the Society's H&S policy, fire plan and emergency procedures as relevant to their role and responsibilities. The Society Committee members with specific H&S roles and responsibilities (detailed in the policy document) include:

- Land and Buildings member.
- Horse and Pony member
- Cattle and Sheep member
- Poultry member
- Bar member
- Sponsorship and Trade Stand (Field) member
- · Trade Stand (Pavilion) member

In addition:

The SAFETY OFFICER shall be responsible for:

- (a) Providing guidance and advice on health and safety matters.
- (b) Liaising with all statutory and external authorities and other appropriate organisations.
- (c) Investigating and recording all accidents, incidences and other H&S adverse events.
- (d) Briefing and training all officials and stewards on the emergency procedure prior to the show day.
- (e) Co-ordinating health and safety and the response to emergency and major incidents in the Showground.
- (f) Coordinate the reporting of incidents in accordance to RIDDOR if/as required.
- (g) The arrangements detailed in Part 3 of this policy for Emergency Procedures, RIDDOR, Fire Precautions, and Safety Information are implemented.
- (h) A Fire Plan and Emergency Evacuation Procedures for the Pavilion are in place to respond to a major H&S incident

ORGANISERS, TRADE STAND PERSONNEL, CONTRACTORS and their respective employees as well as Estate Owners and their Agents are responsible for ensuring that:

- (a) Everything reasonably practicable is done to ensure the Health, Safety and Welfare of those attending the show.
- (b) They conduct themselves and their activities so that they do not put themselves or anyone else at risk.
- (c) The access to, and egress, from the site is safe and unobstructed.

MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC AND COMPETITORS are equally responsible for ensuring that they do not put other persons at risk or compromise the health and safety of others by their acts or omissions, and that they co-operate with the organisers in complying with Health and Safety legislation.

HEALTH AND SAFETY ARRANGEMENTS

ELECTRICITY – the position and routes of overhead and underground are known, and temporary electrical cables and distributions systems will be agreed; evidence of recent examination and test certificates for electrical installations and apparatus will be obtained for show ground installations and from individual exhibitors; earthing and earth leakage protection will be provided as necessary.

GENERATORS must be positioned well clear of tentage, straw bales, etc., which can, and do easily catch fire.

LIQUID PETROLEUM GAS – Trade Stand personnel and Caterers with LPG appliances should have had these examined and tested by a competent person.

MACHINERY & EQUIPMENT – All machinery and equipment should only be operated with adequate safety precautions in place, by competent or supervised people, provided with appropriate personal protective equipment.

ANIMALS – Routes used by Horses, Public and Vehicles will, as far as possible, be kept separate. Horses are not allowed into the Trade Stand and Catering areas. Dogs should be kept on leads at all times and children must be supervised by an adult.

FIRE PRECAUTIONS – The local Fire Brigade will be consulted concerning Emergency access for Fire Brigade Vehicles and Emergency exits. Adequate Emergency firefighting equipment and appliances will be been provided.

SAFETY INFORMATION - Warning notices and signs are prominently displayed. First Aid sites are clearly marked.

TOILET AND WASHING FACILITIES - Adequate provision has been made for the expected number of visitors.

FOOD HYGIENE – Caterers are responsible for complying with the Local Environment Health Department legislation/Food Safety Act.

LICENSING FOR ALCOHOLIC REFRESHMENTS - Licences are held for alcohol sale.

GENERAL:

- a) If any person attending the Show fails to comply with the reasonable requirements relating to Health and Safety at the Show, then the Society will have the right to eject that person from the Show.
- b) If Society officials fail to take adequate action where a breach comes to their notice, then they could perhaps find themselves, albeit unwittingly, in the position of condoning a breach of the regulations.
- All persons attending the Show, whether they be Officials, Competitors or Members of the Public, MUST COMPLY WITH THE HEALTH AND SAFETY REGULATIONS.

All Summer Qualifying shows affiliated to the B.S.P.S. are qualifiers for the "B.S.P.S. Classic Services Group Challenge", ponies qualify as follows:

B.S.P.S Challenge – Open Lead Rein, First Ridden, Show Pony, SHP, WHP, Cradle Stakes, Nursery Stakes, Int SRT, SH, WH and Heritage M&M Lead rein, First Ridden, Ridden & WHP. This show is a qualifier for the BSPS challenge. Animals must qualify for the challenge by attending any BSPS affiliated show and competing in the appropriate class.

Ponies must not have qualified for the 2022 Horse of The Year show in the appropriate class.

B.S.P.S. COLOURED HORSE & PONY SOCIETY (Affiliation No 22-070) www.chapsuk.com

Both owner and the rider/exhibitor need not be a member of CHAPS (UK) nor must the horse or pony be registered with CHAPS (UK) to compete. However, in order to Qualify both Owner and Rider/Exhibitor need to be a current Showing Member and have a valid Qualifier card. Members should apply to CHAPS UK for the appropriate Qualifier card.

The CHAPS (UK) Championship Show will be held on 10th – 13th August 2022. Shows held on or after 7th August will count as 2023 qualifiers.

The following classes are CHAPS (UK) Qualifiers [60-65]. For full rulings and information on competition/qualification, please refer to the CHAPS (UK) Members' Handbook; or visit www.chapsuk.com for rulings. Only Skewbalds/Piebalds may compete in these classes.

All stallions, 4 years old and over entering these classes must be graded with CHAPS (UK), and must wear Stallion discs ID Discs in the ring without exception.

Classes must be confined to SPS-BS registered ponies. Ponies **must be named on the entry form** and in the catalogue. Society rosettes must only be given to ponies registered with the Society or to foals eligible for registration.

Three year old fillies with foals at foot may not be shown. All foals must be a minimum of three weeks old on the day of the Show.

IN ORDER TO ENTER A STALLION CLASS AT AFFILIATED SHOW, ENITRE MALES AGED 4 YEARS OLD & OVER MUST HAVE AN 'S' NUMBER & HAVE BEEN SUCCESSFULLY THROUGH ETHER THE SPS-BS STALLION ASSESSMENT PROIOR TO 2006 OR THE CURRENT SPSBS VOLUNTARY VETERINARY EXAMINATION. Ridden stallions MUST display a stallion bridle badge. In-hand entire males 2 years & over are advised to display a stallion bridle badge.

There must be no colts or entire males in Young Handlers classes. Children under 16 years old may not show colts (excluding foals)or entire males in the in-hand classes. Children under 12 on the day of the show may not show entire males in ridden classes. In the interest of safety, hard hats must be worn by all handlers aged 14 years of age & under in the In-hand classes., & worn by all exhibitors in Ridden classes. Ridden ponies must be 4 years old or over. Exhibitors should not kneel but remain standing while in the ring. In ridden classes, if a rider falls off at any time whilst in the ring, both pony and rider must leave the ring, rider dismounted, and take no further part.

RULES

- This is a knockout relay competition, and will be held in the main ring at approximately 5.30p.m.
- · A team of four riders and four horses, one person to be nominated as Chef d'Equipe.
- Riders to have hunted regularly with their hunt. Each team must include at least 3 riders over the age of 18.
- One Junior rider is permitted, 16 years or over on the day of the show.
- · Neither excessive use of the crop nor carrying it in the mouth is permitted when competing.
- Riders are expected to be correctly dressed for a day's hunting and wearing BSI standard headgear.
- · Spurs are not allowed.
- Must have hunted regularly with their respective Hunt, should be owned by members and stabled within their hunt county.
- Each team is permitted to bring an extra horse in case of an accident/injury. 14-2hh minimum height.

The Course will comprise of jumps & obstacles designed to be similar to those encountered during a day's hunting.

Two identical interconnecting courses will be set out in mirror image, designed to be jumped by two horses at a time.

Fences that may be encountered are Tiger Traps, Picnic Tables, Hunting Gates, Bending Poles, straw Bales, Tyres, Brushes, Water Trays, Walls, Ditches and a Bullfinch etc.

Obstacles, direction & course plan may change at the discretion of the Course Director.

The WHP Ring (3) will be made available with a practice fence if classes have been completed.

Assemble in the ring within the holding box. First members of the team line up on start, when given signal will set off. On completion of the course the first rider must cross the finish line and hand over the baton/crop to the next member. This is repeated until all 4 team members have completed the course. The first team to have all four members across the finish line wins.

Team members are required to stay within the holding area and it is their responsibility to keep out of the way of other competitors.

No outside help is permitted, ring stewards to assist if necessary.

Knockdowns, falls & refusals will not be penalised, however after 3 refusals at any one fence, competitors must make their way back to the holding area, exchange with the next team member who must continue form the place of refusal and on completing must reduce to a walk in the holding area before continuing their round.

In the event of a team member retiring the next member must start from the point of retirement and continue as above.

Competitors will be stopped if there is a fall to a horse or rider or if a horse becomes loose, then the restart will be from the point of stoppage.

Declaration to be made by the Chef d'Equipe at the Secretary's Office an hour before the start of competition.

Teams will compete in draw order, which will have been made prior to the show.

Commentary A completed pro-forma with team members listed in competition order will be required for the commentator.

A second team from the same Hunt may be entered but will only be allowed to compete if there is a withdrawal from the starting entries. Please contact the secretary Jacqueline Hinds on 18th May for confirmation of starting entries.
